HISTORIAN NEWS

Fellow Members,

In writing about this Member it did not take long to come up with ideas only because we have been friends for over a half a Century. Not only did he get me into the BTC over 25 years ago but he also brought in John Delano, Mike Loye, Tom Martelli, and two of his Brothers, Rick and Keith, for a short time. Gary Klonowski joined the BTC in 1993. His Sponsors were long time Member's Denny Wirth and Jim Gallagher who wanted to bring Gary in for his bowling prowess. But let's go back way before that to his time in High School where he gained this ability bowling for the St. Lawrence Bowling Team. During High School Gary worked at the McDonald's in Bridgeview and became a Manager there. However after High School with the Viet Nam War going on Gary was drafted. He was one of the lucky ones who, because of his stature, was made a MP in the Army and when stationed overseas was extremely lucky to be sent to Ethiopia. He served from 1970-1972 and told me about the time, while there, that the Sergeant in Charge put Gary on Guard Duty on the day of a bowling match between his Division and another. The Officer in charge sent another MP to take his place so he could be at their rivalry match to represent his Division and told the Sergeant to never do that again or he would be on Guard Duty. After High School Gary came back to McDonald's and ran the Bridgeview Store until 1991. At that point the original owner's family was going to sell and the chance to become a part owner of a very lucrative business was fading away. So Gary took to a completely different field and with his Fatherin-Law, long time BTC Member, Med Molick, in 1991 started a new construction company called MGM Builders who successfully remodeled and built kitchens, bathrooms, roof top additions, basements and add ons until he officially retired last year. I can attest to the quality of their work as can thousands others since his company did work for me in Illinois and Indiana. As for that bowling prowess Gary has bowled three 299 games and three 300's including the first one ever bowled at El Mar Bowl in Bridgeview in 1979. Plus two with the BTC, the first that I was lucky enough to be on his Team for when we bowled for the Tri Star Team in 1998. He also shot one again 19 years apart in 2017. So at this rate he has one more coming in 2036 when he is Gar Ward's age. I wouldn't bet against either of them. Gary's Teams have won the Bowling Calcutta a couple of times when the entries and winnings were much greater than now. Gary also has run many Bowling Squads in the past. I bowled with him on many of his over 30 squads for the Peterson Classic going back to the days on Archer and 35th. He also ran over 30 years of teams going to the Slovak Tournaments in Ohio and Pennsylvania. And over 30 years of USBC Tournaments where Tony Alexander and I were lucky to be on his Spare Parts Teams. In 1999 Gary and his wife of 48 years, Gail, bought a condo in Wisconsin Dells just off the strip. They plan on moving up there permanently some day. Gary plays a lot of golf and bowls a little bit at the one bowling alley in the Dells. He has managed to get two hole-in-ones in Wisconsin. I also want to mention that Gary served the BTC as President in 2016 and want to Thank him again for the Club's and his Military Service. Gary and Gail's one Daughter, Marilyn and Son-in-Law Tony live near Orlando Florida where Marilyn works at Disney World. Before they moved down there she also was lucky enough to have her Parents give her a once in a lifetime Disney Wedding. Gary has had a couple of health issues in the past few years and I can attest that he is well on the way to recovery. We are hoping to see him back to his old self soon and back competing at the bowling alley and the golf links.
