BOWLING NEWS

Another week of bowling is the books! Scoring seemed quite a bit higher this week, guys are starting to get dialed in for the end of the season position rounds and roll-offs. Calcutta and our year end pay-off and banquet are only 4 weeks away. A few of us talked about some different ideas on the Calcutta in the bar after bowling. One thing I would like to remind all bowlers of is that if a team i.e. Smokeys Bandits wins both halves of their division. The team from that division that will make the roll-off's is the team in that division that has won the most points from the start of the year. This is covered by rule #22 (highlighted below) in our Bowling Rules:

22. The league will bowl in two divisions, decided by total pins plus handicap after the first four weeks are bowled. The top half of the teams will be in the "A" division. The bottom half of the teams will be in the "B" division. If there is an odd number of teams the extra team will be placed in the "A" division. The league will bowl two (2) halves, with 12 weeks in each half. A team can win both halves. If a team

wins both halves, the team with the most points won year to date in that division at that point will advance to the championship roll-off. *The winners of the halves from both the “A” division and the “B” division teams will roll-off the last week to determine the champion. The champion will be decided by the most total pins with handicap for the three (3) game series. Only bowlers on the team’s roster can bowl in the championship roll off. Floating Substitutes are not allowed in the championship roll-offs.*

I have added a column in the standings (see in newsletter) YTD Won showing the total points won for the season so the teams in contention for this “wild card” spot can follow along and see where they stand if, in fact, one team does win both halves of a division. I have this week’s standing sheets prior to adding this column, but have added it moving forward so it will be on the standings sheets after bowling this week.
