
More Accolades:

The History of D-Day

On June 6, 1944, the Allies launched the largest amphibious invasion in history, marking a pivotal moment in World War II. Known as D-Day, this operation, code named Operation Overlord, was aimed at liberating Nazioccupied France and ultimately defeating Hitler's forces in Europe.

Planning and Preparation

The planning for D-Day began in earnest in 1943. Under the command of General Dwight D. Eisenhower, Supreme Commander of the Allied Expeditionary Force, meticulous preparation was crucial. The Allies amassed a force of over 156,000 troops, comprising American, British, Canadian, and other Allied nations' soldiers.
